ALCOHOLIC AND TOBACCO COMMISSION:

Lee Slavinkas – Informed the group that each alcohol vendor has to renew their liquor license every two (2) years. He was pleased to announce the vast majority of issues facing alcohol-serving establishments were handled 95% of the time by excise police. What that means is when it comes to carding individuals and the overall process of purchase, establishments are abiding by all regulations. SBPD confirmed and agreed that the majority of issues facing alcohol-selling establishments pertained to the individuals consuming the alcohol, not the establishments selling/serving.

CITY OF SOUTH BEND UPDATES/CONCERNS:

Tim Lancaster – Noted a fall in burglaries since the spike in late Fall of 2016. Encouraged the students to continue their due diligence to reporting any suspicious behavior.
