### NOTRE DAME UPDATES/CONCERNS:

Corey Robinson – Announced Becca Blais as the new Student Body President. March 27<sup>th</sup>, the former Treasurer of the United States Rosie Rios will come to speak at the ND Campus and that is open to the public.

Tim Sexton – Announced the Robinson Community Learning Center Shakespeare Club will be traveling to London this summer and will be performing twice. The 175<sup>th</sup> Anniversary known as the Notre Dame Trail will take place August 26<sup>th</sup>.

### HOLY CROSS COLLEGE UPDATES/CONCERNS:

Kelly Jordan – Reaffirmed the MOU for the Sexual Assault Response Team. April 22<sup>nd</sup> is the day for the ‘Saints Run’ that will start and end at the old St. Joseph High School. Registration will start at 7:30 a.m. and the run will start at 8:30 a.m. It is a fundraiser 50/50 for the Sisters of Holy Cross and the Brothers of Holy Cross.

#### SAINT MARY’S COLLEGE UPDATES/CONCERNS:

Emma McCarthy – Announced that the the Angela Athletic Facility construction is still on time. She also talked about the conversation had between Saint Mary’s College and the Notre Dame Police Chief Keri Kei Shibata and how well that went. SMC is also in the process of the student government elections. April 21<sup>st</sup>, the three local campuses will be sponsoring the ‘Take Back the Night’ program.

Janielle Tchakerian – Explained that SMC was in a consortium with other institutions in Indiana to end sexual assault on campuses. She announced the creation of a SMC Sexual Assault Response Team.

#### INDIANA UNIVERSITY SOUTH BEND UPDATES/CONCERNS:

Leah Klopfenstein – Announced IUSB Student Government is in an election period as of now, and she is running for President. She is focusing on establishing a relationship with the Martins on Ironwood. Currently, IUSB has no affiliation with the Martins right across from the student housing on Ironwood, and she would like to see how student meal plans might be accepted there.

Stephen Salisbury – Announced the new ‘Crimson Card’ as the new student and faculty Identification Card. The card is compliant with Voter ID Laws as well and can be used for voter registration. He also discussed the IUSB JubileeFest, that celebrates one hundred (100) years of classes being offered by IU, fifty (50) years of graduating classes, and twenty-five (25) years for the school of the arts. He explained the ‘Party of the Century’ on June 17<sup>th</sup> which is a large fundraising effort for an alumni scholarship that will be available to any student. He also commended a student’s vision and drive to fundraise and host an event to help the Syrian refugees.

#### RESIDENTS/NEIGHBORS UPDATES AND CONCERNS:

Marguerite Taylor – Stated April 8<sup>th</sup> is the ‘Back the Bend’ event. It is a bus tour for senior citizens to the campuses.

#### CITY OF SOUTH BEND UPDATES/CONCERNS:

Bill Thompson – Stated it has been a good year with good relationships between the community and County Police.

Tim Lancaster – Stated it has also been a very good year this year with regard to the relationship between students and the police force.

Adriana Rodriguez – Updated the committee on SB-558 and the language in the bill that would make the South Bend Chronic Nuisance Ordinance null and void. She encouraged committee members to contact legislators and voice their opposition to the bill. Ms. Rodriguez also announced that this would be her last meeting, as she has accepted a new job.

A member from the community that did not provide their name came to speak to the committee and object to the proposed substation relocation for AEP.

Gavin Ferlic thanked all members for coming and set the next date for the CCAC Committee Meeting as April 25<sup>th</sup>, at 3:30 p.m. in the Council Informal Meeting Room on the 4<sup>th</sup> floor of the County-City Building.
