


In 2007 the South Bend City Council passed an ordinance which created the CCAC. Since its creation, the CCAC has been working "in the spirit of promoting positive collaboration and pro-active measures" among the "town & gown communities".

Today, CCAC consists of 24 members who meet monthly during the academic school year. Members include student and university officials from Holy Cross, Saint Mary's, Notre Dame, Indiana University South Bend, and Ivy Tech. Government officials include individuals from the Sheriff's Office, South Bend Mayor's Office, Code Enforcement, Legal, Police & the South Bend City Council. CCAC members also include neighborhood residents, a realtor, a landlord, and representatives from the Robinson Center & the Alcohol Beverage Board.
