Review appropriation ordinance requests from the Department of Public Works which include six (6) Divisions: Engineering, Environmental Services, Equipment Services, Sustainability, Transportation and Water Works.

Review requests for vacation of public streets and alleys, which are first referred to the Board of Public Works for review and recommendation before the Common Council takes final action.

The governing state law in *Indiana Code* § 36-7-3-12 through 16. Local procedures are set forth in the *South Bend Municipal Code* §18-53.8 through §18-53.10. The process begins by the person wishing to vacate going to the Engineering Office in the Department of Public Works, 13th Floor County-City Building to informally discuss your request & the process, as well as order the radius map. The Common Council requires a person to:

- File a completed petition, radius map and proposed ordinance, a \$150.00 nonrefundable filing fee along with certified, stamped and addressed envelopes for each owner whose property is within 150' of the exterior boundaries of the property proposed to be vacated; with the Office of the City Clerk on the 4th Floor County-City Building
- 2. If the filing is complete the City Clerk places the title of the proposed ordinance on the Council's next meeting agenda for 1st Reading. At that meeting it is referred to the PW & PV Committee for review and a public hearing date is set.

- 3. Notice to the property owners within 150' is given via the certified mailings of the date of the public hearing. On that date the Public Works & Property Vacation Committee will meet to hear from the person filing the request, receive a recommendation from the Board of Public Works, hold a public hearing and make an advisory recommendation to the South Bend Common Council.
- 4. Public Hearing before the Common Council on the proposed vacation is where the person seeking the vacation publicly states the reasons why it is being sought with the public having the opportunity to voice their opinions.

Suggestions & Governing Criteria:

Talking to the surrounding property owners who may be affected and/or host a meeting **BEFORE** the Council is to take final action. If cross-access easements are recommended by the Board of Public Works, have those documents prepared **BEFORE** the PW & PW Committee meeting. The Council may deny a request if it would:

- \rightarrow Hinder growth or development
- → Make access difficult or inconvenient
- → Hinder public access to public buildings
- \rightarrow Hinder use of public way into the neighborhoods

If a vacation is denied it cannot be refiled for 2 years.
