- 1. The Special Meeting was called to order by Becky Kaiser at 1859 hours. This Special Meeting was set for the Commission to hear two cases involving potentially dangerous or vicious animals.

The City indicated it had a reached a potential agreement with the owners in Case 2018-01 as well. The proposed agreement was recited to the Commission. The Commission asked questions of the City and the owners and also heard from the victim in this case, Sally Goo. The Commission ultimately decided it would take the proposed agreement and would issue a decision as to whether to approve the agreement at the upcoming May 3, 2018 regular meeting.
