Founded in 2012 in anticipation of the presidential election, National Voter Registration Day is designed to create an annual moment when the entire nation focuses on the registering Americans to exercise their most basic right- the right to vote. More than 650,000 Americans have been registered to vote since the inaugural Voter Registration Day.

“I encourage everyone to vote and to take the next step and encourage others to vote. Voting is the foundation of our democracy. Through voting, we get an opportunity to voice our concerns and make decisions about our community. If you do not think your vote matters, take a look at where we have come from and where we are now”, said Council Member Karen L. White.
