Decisions and Key Takeaways

- Community Paramedicine
 - To get a better idea of cost savings to the department and community, we would need to do a deeper dive into reimbursements
- ISO Audit
 - Focusing on areas that would take the least effort and have the most impact on the ISO score
 - Within those categories, some improvements and recommendations have already been implemented—training, community risk reduction, dispatch circuits, hydrant inspection
 - Hydrant flow testing requires more time and manpower and would need to be a joint effort between Water Works and Fire Department
