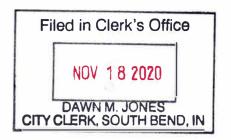

Re: AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SOUTH BEND COMMON COUNCIL AMENDING THE MUNICIPAL CODE TO ADJUST THE WASTEWATER LOW-INCOME CUSTOMER ASSISTANCE PROGRAM RATE

#### Dear President White:

The attached ordinance amends the low-income wastewater customer assistance program to provide a more significant credit to those customers. Clean water and wastewater are essential human needs that require adequate funding to ensure the continued delivery of safe water on a sustained basis. The funding required for these services can put low-income residents in a difficult situation when deciding whether to pay their sewer and water bill, their rent, or buying food. The onset of Covid-19 has made these decisions increasingly difficult as the economic fallout from the pandemic has disproportionately impacted low-income households.

This ordinance amends the low-income customer assistance program and provides a more substantial monthly credit on the wastewater bill that better meets the needs of the residents given the issues brought on by the pandemic. The credit is eligible to sewer customers that meet the low-income thresholds outlined in the State of Indiana Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program guidelines. The ordinance establishes three tiers of credit (\$15, \$21, or \$28.50) depending on the household income and number in the household. A sewer fee of \$2.62 per month per wastewater customer account will be assessed to offset the low-income credits.

I look forward to discussing this ordinance at the Council's Committee meeting and at the public hearing. If you have any further questions or need additional information, please let me know.

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AN ORDINANCE OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH BEND, INDIANA, AMENDING THE SOUTH BEND MUNICIPAL CODE AT SECTIONS 17-132 AND 17-133 OF ARTICLE 15, CHAPTER 17, TO ADJUST THE LOW-INCOME CUSTOMER ASSISTANCE PROGRAM RATE

#### STATEMENT OF PURPOSE AND INTENT

On October 28, 2019 this Council approved and adopted a Wastewater Low-Income Customer Assistance Program (LICAP) to assure that low-income, non-industrial customers of the City's wastewater utility are able to receive the utility's lifeline sewer services. (Ordinance No. 10688-19). The City's LICAP program established a monthly service charge to all City sewer customers at the rate of \$1.75.

Since the date this vital program was adopted, the City of South Bend and the entire nation have been affected by deadly COVID-19, a public health pandemic, exacerbating health and economic distress, especially for low-income persons. Water and wastewater are basic human needs that are essential for survival; however, these services require adequate rate-payer funding to provide. Low-income rate-payers may have to choose between paying for sewer or water service, buying food or paying rent. Unfortunately, the average annual spending on sewer and water service only minimally varies based upon the income level of the rate-payer. Because water and sewer are lifeline issues, the City of South Bend has an obligation to find a way to provide affordable services to low-income non-industrial-rate-payers.

The City's Public Works Department has determined through expert analysis that the current monthly rate of \$1.75 per customer cannot sustain the revenue requirements for an expanded LICAP Program that better meets the needs of the residents given the issues brought on by the pandemic, and that an increase of the monthly charge to \$2.62 per customer is required.

In compliance with Indiana law, notice of this rate adjustment has been mailed to all City Wastewater Utility customers residing outside the boundaries of the City of South Bend.

To assure that the LICAP Program is effective in its coverage of low-income wastewater utility customers, it is necessary and in the best interest of the City that this rate adjustment be made.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH BEND, INDIANA as follows:

**SECTION I.** The South Bend Municipal Code at Section 17-132 of Article 15, Chapter 17 is hereby amended to read in its entirety as follows:

Sec. 17-132. - Sewer Charge.

The sewer charge fee is set for the purpose of offsetting the LICAP Credit. The sewer charge fee shall be one dollar and seventy-five cents (\$1.75) two dollars and sixty-two cents (\$2.62) per month per wastewater Customer account. This charge will be reviewed on the same basis as all other rates and charges in this Chapter.

**SECTION II.** The South Bend Municipal Code at Section 17-133 of Article 15, Chapter 17 is hereby amended to read in its entirety as follows:

Sec. 17-133. - Low-Income Customer Assistance Program Credit.

A LICAP credit shall be available to Eligible Customers of the City who are billed for wastewater charges as provided for in this Ordinance. The amount of such credit will be applied for the applicable billing cycle as follows:

Percentage of the 60% of State of Indiana Median Household Income (MHI)*	Credit Amount
100% of the 60% of Indiana MHI	<u>\$15</u> + <del>\$1.75</del> - <del>\$11.75</del> <u>\$2.62</u> = <u>\$17.62</u>
75% of the 60% of Indiana MHI	<u>\$21</u> + <del>\$1.75</del> - <del>\$15.75</del> <u>\$2.62</u> = <u>\$23.62</u>

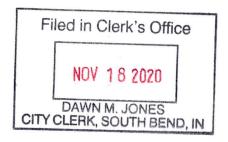

Pursuant to Indiana Code § 36-1-8-4, upon the satisfaction of certain conditions, the Common Council may permit the transfer of a prescribed amount, for a prescribed period, to a fund of the City in need of money for cash flow purposes from another fund of the City. We refer to this as an "interfund loan". The City's Solid Waste department is now in need of an interfund loan to ensure that there is sufficient cash on hand in that department to continue financing its operations and providing trash pickup services for City residents. Accordingly, the attached ordinance authorizes an interfund loan from the City's wastewater department to the solid waste department; to be repaid by June 30, 2021 in accordance with state law.

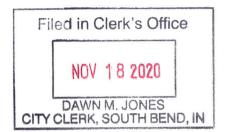

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#### **BILL NO. 63-20**

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AN ORDINANCE OF THE SOUTH BEND COMMON COUNCIL APPROVING AN INTERFUND LOAN FROM FUND 641 (SEWAGE WORKS OPERATIONS) TO FUND 610 (SOLID WASTE OPERATIONS) FOR CASH FLOW PURPOSES AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY IN CONNECTION WITH THE TIME SPECIFIED FOR ITS REPAYMENT

#### STATEMENT OF PURPOSE AND INTENT

Pursuant to Indiana Code § 36-1-8-4, upon the satisfaction of certain conditions, the South Bend Common Council (the "Common Council") may permit the transfer of a prescribed amount, for a prescribed period, to a fund of the City of South Bend (the "City") in need of money for cash flow purposes from another fund of the City, and, where an emergency exists that requires an extension of the prescribed period of the transfer, the prescribed period may be extended for not more than six (6) months beyond the budget year of the year in which the transfer occurs.

During the course of the City's annual budget preparations, meetings, and public hearings culminating in the adoption of the City's 2020 annual budget (on October 14, 2019) as well as the City's 2021 annual budget (on October 12, 2020), the City administration, through the City Controller and other City officers, presented to the Common Council financial projections, estimates, and information concerning the financial condition and operational needs of the City's Solid Waste division within the Department of Public Works and the necessity of the Common Council adopting an increase in the rate paid by users of the Solid Waste division's services in order to finance the division's ordinary operations and avoid reductions in the level of service provided. Through such discussions, such a rate increase was anticipated to be evaluated and considered for adoption by the Common Council during calendar year 2020 in order to establish a sufficient and sustainable level of revenue to support the Solid Waste division's operations in calendar year 2021 and beyond.

In the course of the worldwide pandemic, the spread of novel coronavirus SARS-CoV-2 (causing the COVID-19 disease) in the State of Indiana led Governor Eric Holcomb to declare, and to perpetuate to and beyond the date of this ordinance, a public health emergency as provided under Indiana law. This public health emergency and its attendant economic crises has made increasing the costs to Solid Waste ratepayers untenable during calendar year 2020, while degradation of the level of service provided by the Solid Waste division would be contrary to public health and welfare in the City.

The ongoing operations of the Solid Waste division have exhausted the cash reserves of Fund 610 (Solid Waste Operations) and are projected to draw Fund 610 to a negative cash balance as of December 31, 2020. To avoid ending calendar year 2020 with a negative cash balance in Fund 610 (Solid Waste Operations), the Common Council now desires (a) to approve an interfund transfer on the terms set forth in Exhibit A (the "Loan") attached to this ordinance for the purpose of providing the Solid Waste division sufficient cash flow to maintain normal operations and maintain a positive cash balance through December 31, 2020, and (b) to make the statements required by law to extend the period of the Loan through and including June 30, 2021.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Common Council of the City of South Bend, Indiana, as follows:

SECTION I. The Common Council finds that the Loan is necessary to enhance Fund 610 (Solid Waste Operations) (the "Borrowing Fund") for cash flow purposes, that there are sufficient funds on deposit in Fund 641 - Sewage Works Operations (the "Lending Fund") to make the Loan on the terms set forth in Exhibit A, and that the revenues that will be transferred from the Lending Fund to make the Loan are derived from the levying and collection of property taxes or special taxes or from operation of the political subdivision.

SECTION II. The Common Council has determined that the conditions of the public health emergency and its attendant economic crisis constitute an emergency for purposes of Indiana Code § 36-1-8-4(b), which emergency undermined the City's prospects for proposing and adopting a rate increase to support the Solid Waste division's operations during calendar year 2020. Therefore, the prescribed period of the Loan is permitted to extend for not more than six (6) months beyond the 2020 budget year. Accordingly, the Loan will be repaid from the Borrowing Fund to the Lending Fund on or before June 30, 2021 (the "Maturity Date"), as reflected in Exhibit A.

**SECTION III.** This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.

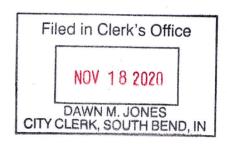

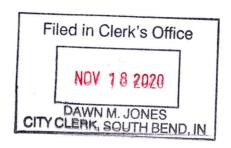

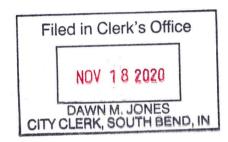

### **BILL NO. 66-20**

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AN ORDINANCE OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH BEND, INDIANA, AMENDING VARIOUS SECTIONS OF THE SOUTH BEND MUNICIPAL CODE TO ADDRESS THE TIMING AND DETAILS OF VARIOUS REPORTS THAT THE CITY ADMINISTRATION SUBMITS TO THE COMMON COUNCIL

### STATEMENT OF PURPOSE AND INTENT

To inform the South Bend Common Council of facts and data relevant to the City's condition and performance, and to assist the Council in assessing the effectiveness of its various policies, the City Administration provides reports and data summaries to the Council from time to time throughout the year as directed by certain Sections of the South Bend Municipal Code. Many of these reports and data summaries are provided by the Department of Administration & Finance.

Presently, the timing of those reports and data from the Department of Administration & Finance is irregular and confusing. To provide greater efficiency and reliability, it is beneficial for that Department to provide its compilation type information to the Council on a regular annual basis at the beginning of each calendar year for the previous year. The Council acknowledges that much of the data and information contained in the compilation reports is available on a regular, ongoing basis through the City's information portals.

This ordinance amends those Sections of the South Bend Municipal Code regarding reporting requirements from the Department of Administration & Finance. It also makes necessary clerical or clarifying corrections to the affected Municipal Code Sections.

### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH BEND, INDIANA as follows:

**SECTION I.** Chapter 13, Article 4, Section 13-57.05 Noise Violation, subpart (d) is hereby amended to read as follows:

SEC. 13-57.05. - VIOLATIONS; PENALTIES; AND DEPOSITS OF FINE MONIES.

(d) One hundred (100) percent of all monies collected and retained by the City for violation of section 13-57 addressing loud and raucous noise regulations shall be deposited into the Police Department Training Fund (Fund #220). Such monies shall be used solely for the purpose designated for such fund. Any and all interest earned on the monies deposited in Fund #220 shall not revert to the gGeneral fFund. The Department of Administration and & Finance shall send monthly written reports an annual report to the Office of the City Clerk detailing the amount of money collected and

the amount of interest earned, with such reporting being filed no later than the last business day of each month. March 31 of the following calendar year.

**SECTION II.** Chapter 14, Article 9, Section 14-60 is hereby amended to read as follows:

SEC. 14-60. - INFORMATION TO BE SENT TO THE COUNCIL'S COMMUNITY RELATIONS COMMITTEE AND THE RESIDENTIAL NEIGHBORHOODS COMMITTEE.

- (a) In the interest of collaboration and information sharing, on or before March 31the first Monday of October; on or before the first Monday of November of each year; and on or before March 1 and June 1 of each year, a summary of the following information from the previous calendar year shall be coordinated and sent by the Office of the City Controller to the Office of the City Clerk for review by the Council's Community Relations Committee and the Council's Residential Neighborhoods Committee:
  - (1) Summary of data from all City agencies, offices and departments involved in the issuance and enforcement of this aArticle for each given time period, including, but not limited to, number and type of permits issued; amount of fees collected; number of warnings issued and addresses of each; amount of citations issued; amount of fines collected and the amount of fines outstanding; number of appeals filed and their disposition; number of pending lawsuits and their status; copies of all educational brochures; dates and locations of all community public safety educational forums held; summary of public comments from such forums; and any other relevant data;
  - (2) Summary of programs in place by any university or college located in, or contiguous to the City limits of South Bend addressing off-campus special events;
  - (3) Compilation of weekly summary sheets developed by the South Bend Police Department listing the address, date, time, problem and resolution for all calls for service to residential areas where boarding house(s) are located; and
  - (4) Community/Campus Advisory Coalition (CCAC) recommendations.
- (b) A joint committee meeting of the Community Relations Committee and the Residential Neighborhoods Committee shall be held within a reasonable period of time following the receipt of such data, with notice being given as required by State law, and such notice also being sent to all City offices who have responsibilities under this article; to all residential neighborhood groups; CCAC Officers, as well as to all universities and colleges who have tendered data. Following such public hearings, said committees shall make any advisory recommendations to the Common Council which it believes are in the best interests of carrying out the public health and safety intent and purposes of Section 14-50.

**SECTION III.** Chapter 20, Article 13, Section 20-134 is hereby amended to read as follows:

SEC. 20-134. - DEPOSIT OF FINE MONIES INTO POLICE DEPARTMENT TRAINING FUND.

- (1) All monies collected and retained by the City for violation of this article shall be deposited into the Police Department Training Fund (Fund #220). Such monies shall be used solely for the purposes designated for such fund. All interest earned on the monies deposited in Fund #220 shall not revert to the General Fund.
- (2) The Department of Administration and & Finance shall send monthly an annual written reports to the Office of the City Clerk, the South Bend Common Council President and the Chair and Vice-Chair of the Common Council's standing Committee on Health and Public Safety detailing the number of tickets issued, the number and amount of fines imposed, the amount of money collected and the amount of interest earned, with such reporting being filed no later than the last business day of each month. March 31 for the previous calendar year.

(Ord. No. <u>10663-19</u>, § I, 10-28-19)

**SECTION IV.** Chapter 2, Article 8, Section 2-122 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2-122. - Regulation of City-owned vehicles.

- (a) On or before each July 31, the City Engineer Controller shall file with the City Clerk an annual motor vehicle report setting forth the following:
  - (1) Name of department, subdepartment, bureau or office to which vehicle is assigned.
  - (2) Vehicle information: Make and year; description; mileage as of June 1 of current calendar year of report; license number; city number.
  - (3) Explanation of the use and need for all City vehicles.
- (b) The Controller shall include all vehicles to be purchased in the line item "Motor Vehicles" in the City budget and shall place them in the budget of the particular department or bureau to use the vehicle.
- (c) All City-owned and leased vehicles shall have inscribed on the front doors the seal of the City and the words "For Official Use Only." They shall have inscribed on the front doors and rear an identifying number not less than five (5) inches in height. This number shall not be used by any other City vehicle. Any other markings may be made on the vehicle which are deemed appropriate by the department using the vehicle.
- (d) Requirements of subsections (a) and (c) shall not apply to vehicles certified under <u>sS</u>tate law. Requirements of subsection (c) shall not apply to cars designated for use by the

Mayor, City Controller, City Attorney Corporation Counsel, City Engineer, and Director of the Economic Development Department of Community Investment, and Director of the Department of Venues, Parks & Arts.

**SECTION V.** Chapter 2, Article 8, Section 2-122.2 is hereby amended to read as follows:

SEC. 2-122.2. - REGULATIONS AND REPORTING MECHANISMS ON CITY USAGE OF ALTERNATIVE FUELS—COMPRESSED NATURAL GAS (CNG) AND LIQUEFIED NATURAL GAS (LNG).

- (a) Purpose and Intent. This section is aimed at promoting greater usage by the City of South Bend of alternative fuels and overall energy efficiency. It is believed that greater usage of alternative fuel vehicle conversion programs, related infrastructure improvements, implementation of more hybrid vehicles, and further diversification of the City's vehicle fleet will result in cleaner air and cost savings for taxpayers. It is further believed that the City should pursue all grants available which are aimed at energy efficiency, reducing energy costs, and reducing fossil fuel emissions.
- (b) Semi-Annual Reporting. In addition to the reporting requirements codified in Section 2-123 of the South Bend Municipal Code, the Central Services Director and other individual(s) designated by the City Controller Director of Public Works in conjunction with the City Energy Director shall file reports on or before July 1st and January 31st15th of each year addressing the following information for the preceding calendar year:
  - (1) Summary of all alternative fuel vehicle grants pursued, including but not limited to, such funding sources as the Alternative Fuel Vehicle (AFV) grant and other grants administered by the Indiana Office of Energy Development. <sup>1</sup>
  - <sup>1</sup> IC 4-4-32.2-1 through IC 4-4-32.2-16 sets forth the regulations addressing the "Alternative Fuel Fueling Station Grant Program"; and IC 4-4-32.3-1 through IC 4-4-32.3-10 sets forth the regulations addressing "Alternative Fuel Vehicle Grant Program for Local Units."
  - (2) Summary of work with the U.S. Department of Energy's Clean Cities organizations such as the Greater Indiana Clean Cities Coalition and the South Shore Clean Cities, Inc.
  - (3) Summary of vehicles that have been retrofitted to use compressed natural gas (CNG) and the savings in gallons of diesel fuel which has resulted.
  - (4) Summary of any outreach programs and/or partnering with other entities including but not limited to, the South Bend Community School Corporation, St. Joseph County, City of Mishawaka, TRANSPO, and other entitles entities that have vehicle fleets aimed at reducing energy demand, summary of measureable measurable

- improvements in fuel efficiency, reduction of fuel costs and related data; bulk purchasing agreements; as well as developing plans for enhanced facility management and increased efficiency.
- (5) Updates on increasing the number public fueling stations in the eity City.
- (6) Summary of all grants pursued from the Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) program of the U.S. Department of Energy administered from the Indiana Office of Energy Development.
- (7) Summary of any other actions/programs aimed at increasing energy efficiency and establishing energy polices.
- (c) Upon receipt of such required filing, the <u>eC</u>ommon Council shall determine whether an in-person report on such information should be scheduled at a Council meeting under "Reports of City Offices" by the individual(s) filing such report.

**SECTION VI.** Chapter 2, Article 4, Section 2-23, subpart (d) is hereby amended to read as follows:

### SEC. 2-23. - FUNDING FROM OTHER SOURCES.

(d) The Department of Administration & Finance shall file with the Council by April 1 of each calendar year an annual report on behalf of All all City departments, agencies, boards, and commissions of the City receiving that received funds pursuant to this section shall file with the Council, during the funding period, annual reports detailing how the moneys have been were spent and obligated during the preceding calendar year.

**SECTION VII.** Chapter 2, Article 7, Section 2-90, subpart (b) is hereby amended to read as follows:

SEC. 2-90. - FINAL BUDGET APPROVAL; REPORT OF CITY CONTROLLER. [24]

(b) As part of its regular monthly financial reporting, The City Controller Department of Administration & Finance shall submit quarterly budget updates to the Common Council and Mayor, within thirty (30) days of the close of each calendar quarter, detailing all revenues received and expenditures made by, and the financial status of, each department.

**SECTION VIII.** Chapter 4, Article 2, Section 4-14, subpart (d) is hereby amended to read as follows:

(d) The Controller shall provide to the Common Council, in writing, the following information

<u>a written "Annual Licensing Fee Report"</u> on <u>a semi-annual basis an annual basis by</u> March 31 for the preceding year. Said report shall provide the following information:

- (1) Number and type of licenses issued.
- (2) Revenue obtained from licenses issued by license category.
- (3) A cost/benefit analysis for license fees charged by the City.
- (4) Recommended changes to license fee structure, if any.

**SECTION IX.** Chapter 4, Article 3, Section 4-18 is hereby amended to read as follows:

- (a) On or before November 1st of each year, the Office of the City Controller shall provide a written "Annual Licensing Fee Report". Said report shall provide a cost/benefit analysis for license fees charged by the City. A summary for each fee and criteria used for all recommended changes shall be included.
- (b) \_\_\_\_ The Common Council shall review all license fees charged by the City. The Personnel and Finance Committee shall recommend to the Common Council on an annual basis any proposed changes following the review of the Annual Licensing Fee Report, as defined in subsection 4-14(d). All fees shall be reasonably related to the cost incurred by the City in regulating activities requiring a license to operate.

**SECTION X.** Chapter 4, Article 4, Section 4-18.5, subpart (t) is hereby amended to read as follows:

### SEC. 4-18.5. - ADULT BUSINESSES.

- (t) Quarterly updates—Annual report. The Controller shall report at the end of each quarter provide by March 31 to the Public Safety Committee of the Common Council a summary of the following public information in connection with adult business licenses for the preceding year:
  - (1) Number of license applications received.
  - (2) Disposition of such applications.
  - (3) Amount of license fees collected.
  - (4) Number of license suspensions.
  - (5) Summary of any administrative reviews.
  - (6) Amount of fines collected.

**SECTION XI.** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.

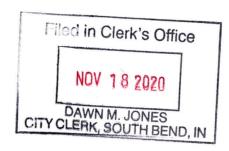

RE: Claims Payment Procedures



Dear President White,

Per Indiana law, the Board of Public Works is charged with the duty and responsibility to approve the payment of certain claims by the City. Under the current system, more than 50% of the City's payments to vendors are required to be approved by the Board <u>prior</u> to payment. This can result in delays in payment that can cause cash-flow difficulties for vendors, particularly small, local vendors that do business with the City.

In the interest of speeding up the payment of vendors, we desire the Common Council to allow payments for all types of claims to be made in advance of Board allowance, as permitted by Indiana Code § 36-4-8-14. We have implemented a variety of new processes and procedures over the past year that have increased the checks and balances in the accounts payable process, and it is important to note that this ordinance does not eliminate the check provided by the Board of Public Works; it merely changes the timing of that check. Additionally, we have enhanced transparency into the vendor payments through the implementation of an online, searchable, public dashboard that lists all payments made by the City. These enhancements in accountability and transparency are vital to ensuring that only properly approved payments are made.

I will present this bill to the Common Council at the appropriate committee and Council meetings. It is requested that this bill be filed for 1st reading on November 23, 2020 with 2nd reading, public hearing and 3rd reading scheduled for December 14, 2020.

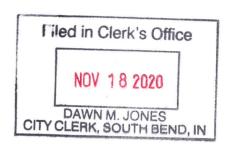

The Board meets regularly to conduct City business that includes the approval of such claims, but the Board's meeting schedule does not always allow claims to be paid in a timely manner.

The Common Council of the City of South Bend, Indiana desires to facilitate the prompt payment of all City vendors, particularly small, local businesses that may experience cash flow shortages if payment is delayed. Additionally, the enactment of prompt payment procedures is a race- and gender-neutral measure that can be used to facilitate the participation of all firms in City contracting and procurement.

The Common Council also recognizes that the City administration has put in place several new policies and procedures that are designed to ensure the accuracy and propriety of claims paid by the City, as well as to enhance transparency and visibility by the public into those claims. These procedural enhancements coincide with the implementation of the City's new Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) system and an online, public financial transparency dashboard.

The Indiana legislature has enacted Indiana Code § 36-4-8-14, as amended from time-to-time, which permits certain types of claim expense payments to be made in advance of Board allowance, including those expenses described in an Ordinance. The Common Council of the City of South Bend, Indiana has determined that payment of claims can be more efficiently processed by the enactment of an ordinance authorizing payment of all claims in advance of Board allowance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH BEND, INDIANA as follows:

**SECTION I.** Chapter 2, Article 5, Section 2-50.1 is hereby amended to read as follows:

### **Section 2-50.1** Preapproved Payment of Claims

(a) The City Controller may pay all claims, for all types of expenses, in advance of allowance by the board having jurisdiction over allowance of the claim. Such claims will be processed and paid in adherence to all requirements of applicable laws and the City Controller's internal policies and procedures.

Unless otherwise addressed by Indiana State law, the Board of Public Works of the City of South Bend, Indiana, on request of the City Controller, may make claim payments in advance of Board allowance of such <u>all</u> claims for the following kinds of expenses:

- (1) Property or services purchased or leased from the United States Government, its agencies, or its political subdivisions;
- (2) License or permit fees;
- (3) Insurance premiums;
- (4) Utility payments or utility connection charges;
- (5) General grant programs where advance funding is not prohibited and contracting party posts sufficient security to cover the amount advanced;
- (6) Grants of State funds authorized by statute;
- (7) Maintenance or service agreements;
- (8) Leases or rental agreements;
- (9) Bond or coupon payments;
- (10) Payroll
- (11) State, Federal; or County taxes;
- (12) Expenses that must be paid because of emergency circumstances;
- (13) Fees and expenses related to real property transactions such as the cost of obtaining title information, and the recording of documents; and
- (14) Other expenses expressly permitted by State statute as amended from time to time.
- (b) Each payment of claim made shall be supported by a fully itemized invoice or bill and certification of the City Controller, and the Board of Public Works shall review and allow the claim at its next regular or special meeting following the pre-approved payment of the expense.
- (c) Notice of any claims requested to be made in advance of Board allowance except for claims of a payroll nature, shall be simultaneously submitted by the City Controller to the Office of the City Clerk for informational purposes.

**SECTION II.** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.

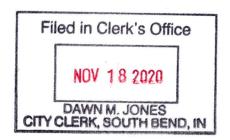

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### AN ORDINANCE OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH BEND, INDIANA, ADOPTING AN INVESTMENT POLICY FOR THE CITY OF SOUTH BEND

### STATEMENT OF PURPOSE AND INTENT

The Indiana legislature has enacted Indiana Code § 5-13-9 et seq., which permits the fiscal officer of a city to make investments of public funds into designated investment vehicles. The Common Council of the City of South Bend has determined that it is in the best interest of the City to authorize the full exercise of the City's investment powers under the Indiana Code. Accordingly, this ordinance establishes an investment policy for the City of South Bend, as provided under Indiana Code § 5-13-9-5.7, and thereby authorizes the City Controller to dedicate up to the maximum allowable proportion of the City's investment portfolio to investments maturing more than two years but not more than five years after purchase. In addition, this ordinance specifically authorizes the City Controller to invest in certain investment vehicles as provided under Indiana Code § 5-13-9-5 and Indiana Code § 5-13-9-5.3.

### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH BEND, INDIANA as follows:

**SECTION I.** For purposes of Indiana Code § 5-13-9, the investment policy for the City of South Bend is approved and shall read as follows:

With the approval of the City Controller, as the investing officer for the City of South Bend, the City may invest public funds in various investment vehicles, in accordance with Title 5, Article 13, of the Indiana Code, as amended from time to time. The City's investment portfolio may contain any investment vehicle generally provided for under Indiana Code § 5-13-9. In addition, the City Controller is granted the following specific authorizations:

- 1. Pursuant to Indiana Code § 5-13-9-5.7, the City Controller is authorized to make investments having a stated final maturity that is more than two (2) years but not more than five (5) years after the date of purchase or entry into a repurchase agreement, provided that such investments may comprise no more than twenty-five percent (25%) of the total portfolio of public funds invested by the City, including balances in transaction accounts.
- 2. Pursuant to Indiana Code § 5-13-9-5, the City Controller is authorized to invest in certificates of deposit of certain depositories, as defined by and subject to the requirements of Indiana Code § 5-13-9-5, which authorization will expire on December 14, 2021.
- 3. Pursuant to Indiana Code § 5-13-9-5.3, the City Controller is authorized to

invest in interest bearing deposit accounts that satisfy the conditions stated in Indiana Code § 5-13-9-5.3(b).

This policy shall be effective from January 1, 2021, until its expiration on December 31, 2021, unless earlier amended by ordinance.

**SECTION II.** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.
