  - B. The requirements were laid out and voted on at this time.
    - 1. Make sure dog is contained.
    - 2. There must be fencing put up to keep dog from escaping.
    - 3. Dog must be up to date on all shots.
    - 4. Dog must be spayed or neutered.
    - 5. Dog when outside must be put into a five sided kennel.
    - 6. If dog is walked or outside the fence must be on a leash and muzzle.
    - 7. All of the children within the residence must be made to understand the reuirements.

C. Motion for dog to be deemed potentially dangerous voted 2 to 1. The owner now has seven days to comply with the Commission's decision.
