II. REGULAR MEETING

December 21, 2022

The Board of Public Safety met in the Regular Meeting at 9:16 a.m. on Wednesday, December 21, 2022, with Board President Daniel Jones (absent), and Board Members Darryl Heller, Lee Ross, and Al Kirsits were present. Also present were Police Chief Scott Ruszkowski, Assistant Fire Chief Todd Skwarcan, and Attorneys Danielle Weiss, Kylie Connell, Adam Taylor, and Board Clerk Theresa Heffner was also present. All of the aforementioned individuals have met the Commission requirements of the South Bend Police Department.



7. FILE MONTHLY STATISTICAL ANALYSIS REPORT NOVEMBER 2022

Chief Scott Ruszkowski submitted the monthly statistical analysis report for November. He noted a fourteen percent (14%) reduction in Part 1 Offenses. He estimated upwards of forty percent (40%) of cases have some type of mental episode involvement, and then he emphasized the importance of mental health resources in the community and policing.
