**COPY OF VACATION RESOLUTION.**

No. 8, 1902

RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS OF THE CITY OF SOUTH BEND, INDIANA: That it is desirable to vacate the following:

All that portion of Pennsylvania Avenue contained between the second angle east of High street as now located and the west line of Miami street, being a strip of land 60 feet wide, ~~beginning at said second angle~~ running as follows: beginning at said second angle east of High street, running thence south  $75\frac{1}{2}$  degrees east  $3\frac{1}{2}$  feet, thence north  $89\frac{3}{4}$  degrees east to the west line of Miami street.

The following property may be injuriously or beneficially effected by such vacation:

all of the property of Martin L. Wenger lying adjacent and within 150 feet of said Pennsylvania Avenue.

**Notice of Resolution of Vacation.**

City of South Bend, Indiana. - Department of Public Works.

Notice is hereby given that the Board of Public Works of said City at a meeting of said Board, held on the 3d day of February 1902 adopted a resolution for the vacation of the following described property:

All that portion of Pennsylvania avenue contained between the second angle east of High street as now located and the west line of Miami street; being a strip of land 60 feet wide, running as follows: beginning at said second angle east of High street, running thence south 75 1/2 degrees east 313 1/2 feet, thence north 89 1/4 degrees east to the west line of Miami street.

The object of such vacation is to move a part of Pennsylvania avenue between High and Miami streets, 30 feet north of its present location.
