COPY OF VACATION RESOLUTION.

No. 12, 1902

RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS OF THE CITY OF SOUTH BEND, INDIANA: That it is desirable to vacate the following:

Beginning at a point distant East 1350 feet from the north west corner of Section 7 in Township 37 North, Range 3 East, thence south to the North line of Jefferson street, thence South easterly on the north line of Jefferson street to a point 50 feet at right angles east, thence north parallel with west line and 50 feet distant therefrom to the north line of said Section 7, thence west 50 feet to the place of beginning. The above description is that of a public street, Sunnyside Avenue, which was once before, under Vacations Resolution No. 7, moved 50 feet east.

The following property may be injuriously or beneficially effected by such vacation:

All that land lying between the east line of said Sunnyside Avenue and the city limits, also a strip 100 feet wide lying along the west line of and adjacent to said Sunnyside Avenue.

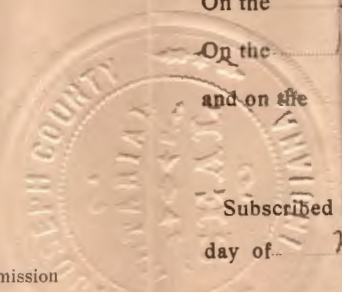

The present Sunnyside Avenue to be vacated is described as beginning at a point distant east 1350 ft. from the north west corner of Sec. 7, Tp. 37 north range 3 east, thence south to the north line of Jefferson Street, thence south easterly on the north line of Jefferson Street to a point 50 ft. at right angles east, thence north parallel with west line and 50 ft. distant therefrom to the north line of the said section 7, thence west 50 ft. to the place of beginning.

The new location of Sunnyside avenue is to be as follows:

Beginning at a point distant east 1400 ft. from the N. W. Corner of Sec. 7 in Tp. 37 north range 3 east, thence south to the north line of Jefferson Street, thence south easterly on the north line of Jefferson street to a point 50 ft' at right angles east, thence north parallel with west line and 50 ft. distant therefrom to the north line to said section 7, thence west 50 ft. to the place of beginning.
