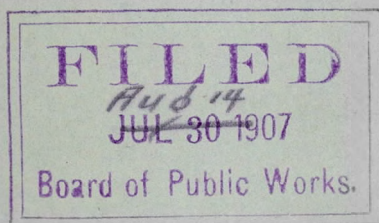

COPY OF VACATION RESOLUTION.

No. 48, 1907

RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS OF THE CITY OF SOUTH BEND, INDIANA: That it is desirable to vacate the following:

The alley between the south east corner of lot 129 and the south west corner of lot 128, both in Daniel Garst's First Addition to the City of South Bend City, now a part of said City of South Bend, and extending north to the south line of lot 248 in said Addition, and running thence east to the west line extended, of lot 250 in Daniel Garst's Re-plat of lots 121 to 126, both inclusive, of his said First Addition to South Bend City (said alley from Tutt Street to this point being fourteen (14) feet wide) and running thence south between lot 250 and lot 251 in said Re-plat on the east and lot 127 in said First Addition on the west, to Tutt Street. 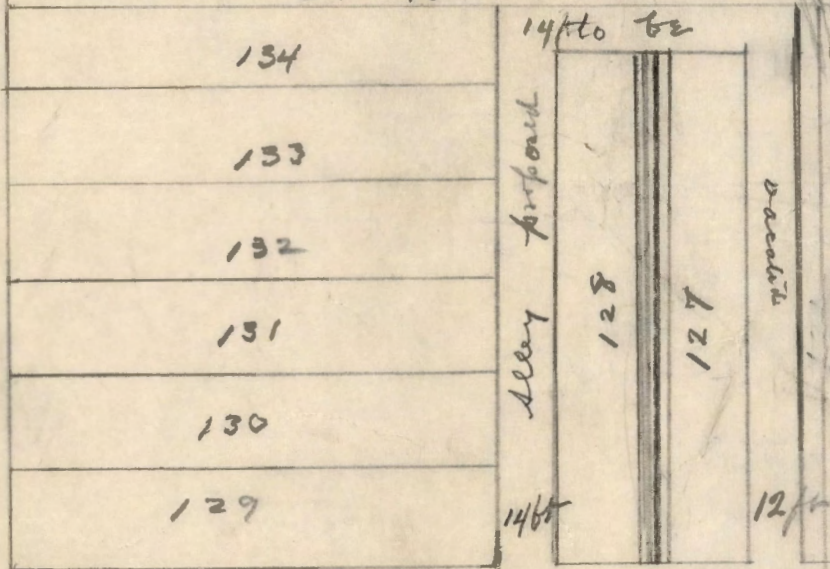

South Bend, Ind., August 14, 1907

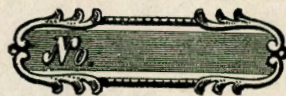
To the Board of Public Works

The undersigned petitioner respectfully petitions for the vacation of the alley described as commencing at the North line of Tutt Street in the City of South Bend, Saint Joseph County, State of Indiana, between the South East corner of Lot 129 and the South West corner of Lot 128, both in Daniel Garst's First Addition to South Bend City, now a part of said City of South Bend, and extending North to the South line of Lot 248 in said Addition and running thence East to the West line, extended, of Lot 250 in Daniel Garst's Re-plat of Lots 121 ~~and~~ 126, both inclusive, of his said First Addition to South Bend City (said alley from Tutt Street to this point being fourteen (14) feet wide) and running thence South between said Lot 250 and Lot 251 in said Re-Plat on the East and Lot 127 in said First Addition on the West, to Tutt Street (said part of the alley being twelve feet wide). The location of said alley is shown on the plat hereto attached as a part hereof. This petitioner owns all the lots and lands abutting on said alley except said Lots 250 and 251, which are now owned by Vandalia Railroad Company.

This alley has not been used by the public for many years and is not of any public convenience or utility.
