

> THE FIRST ALLEY EAST OF HIGH STREET EXTENDING SOUTHERLY FROM PENNSYLVANIA AVENUE A DISTANCE OF APPROXIMATELY 198.6 FEET, MORE OR LESS. WHICH IS TERMINATION OF SAID ALLEY.

RESERVING ALL PUBLIC UTILITY RIGHTS AND THE RIGHTS OF THE MUNICIPAL CITY OF SOUTH BEND TO CONSTRUCT AND MAINTAIN ALL PUBLICLY OWNED UTILITIES AND SURFACE WATER CONTROL STRUCTURES AND DITCHES WITHIN THE VACATED RIGHT-OF-WAY.

- Petition of Cardinal Bottling Company, Inc. and Reliable Dairy, Inc. to vacate an alley, which said alley is the first alley east of High Street and extending northerly from Broadway Street a distance of approximately 140 feet, more or less.
- 3. Petition of Cardinal Bottling Company, Inc., and Reliable Dairy, Inc. to vacate the first alley east of High Street extending southerly from Pennsylvania Avenue a distance of approximately 188.6 feet, more or less.

Attorney Don Blackmond appeared representing the petitioners on both of the proposed alley vacation petitions. He indicated that there are three residences along the alley which runs north from Broadway but that they have no garages on the alley and that it is not used for ingress or egress.

In response to a question from the Commission, Mr. Blackmond stated that the petitions for vacation were only signed by the petitioners and not by another other abutting property owners but that they had no objection to the vacation petitions.

Mr. Blackmond indicated that they have no plans to build across the alley if it is vacated but that they desire the vacation for control purposes only. On the basis of this there would be no problem in providing the necessary utility easements.

No one further appeared.

Following discussion of the matter it was moved by Mr. Lehman, seconded by Mr. Pavey and unanimously carried that the petitions be tabled until the November 21, 1967 meeting and that the petitioner be advised that he should secure the permission of the abutting property owners in writing and be made aware of the fact that if the alley is closed only half will legally belong to the petitioner.

EXCERPTS FROM THE MINUTES OF THE AREA PLAN COMMISSION MEETING OF NOVEMBER 21, 1967

The Plan Commission staff indicated that the attorney for the petitioners has submitted consent petitions signed by the abutting property owners.

During the discussion the following point was raised.

1. Does Schrader Furniture Company have access to this alley and are they an abutting property owner?

After further consideration it was moved by Mr. Taylor, seconded by Mr. Helvie and unanimously carried that the petitions be recommended favorably to the Board of Public Works subject to their investigation to determine if all abutting property owners have signed the consent petitions.

GRANT OF EASEMENT

THIS EASEMENT made this 19 day of February, 1968, by and between Cardinal Bottling Company, Inc.; Reliable Dairy, Inc.; Northern Indiana Public Service Company; and H. J. Schrader Co., Inc., hereinafter referred to as the "Grantors", and the City of South Bend, Indiana, hereinafter referred to as the "Grantee";

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Grantors are the owners of real estate adjoining a certain public alley described as the first alley east of High Street extending southerly from Pennsylvania Avenue a distance of approximately 188.6 feet, which alley is being vacated pursuant to Vacation Resolution No. 3230; and

WHEREAS, the Grantors are desirous of executing and giving an easement to the Grantee to construct and maintain all publicly owned utilities and surface water control structures and ditches within said vacated right-of-way.

Now this Grant of Easement,

WITNESSETH:

That the Grantors hereby grant unto the Grantee the full and free right and authority to construct and maintain all publicly owned utilities and such water control structures and ditches within the vacated right-of-way and to agree not to build any buildings or a canopy having a clearance of less than 13 feet on said vacated right-of-way on the real estate hereinbefore described.
