



The staff has reviewed this petition relative to IC 36-7-3-13. It is the staff's opinion that:


- (1) The vacation *would not* hinder the growth or orderly development of the unit or neighborhood in which it is located or to which it is contiguous.

Mayor Luecke has made the City Plan process one that gives each of us the opportunity to take part in suggesting ways to make South Bend an even better place to live, work and play. As we look at ways to grow our neighborhoods, we are looking for partners to create opportunities for retail and commercial growth that will serve the neighborhoods. The Buxton Group, a retail strategy consulting company, is doing an analysis of four areas in our city to determine retail trends, drive times, critical mass and other indicators that support retail growth. The west side of South Bend, both on Lincoln Way West and Western Avenue are two of the areas in the study. This study will provide us with information and marketing strategies to approach retailers with. Our goal is to create a marketing plan that will address the needed services and stores in each of the four areas.



City Plan is a 20 year comprehensive plan for our city that will look to the future and sustainability.

The Community Development Division of this department provides grant opportunities to organizations that work with youth and minorities. If you would like more information about those grants, please let me know. If I recall from the discussions at the economic development table at the City Plan meeting at the Charles Black Center, you were concerned with training and jobs for minorities. The Department of Workforce Development, through the Work One Centers, provides job banks, job placement assistance, and training programs.
