Clerk Tirado read the bill to the Council for its second (2nd) reading.

After the second (2nd) reading, Councilmember Shiela Niezgodski stated that Bill No. 49-25 went before the Public Works and Property Vacation Committee and comes with a favorable recommendation.

Councilmember Warner invited the petitioner to speak before the council.

Chris Dressel, Senior Planner in the Department of Community Investment, with offices on the fourteenth (14th) floor of the County-City Building, South Bend, IN 46601, stated that Bill No. 49-25 is a request to vacate parts of Lincolnway West, Leland Avenue, and West Marion Street. He said that matching up lot lines is the final step of an intersection improvement that was completed in 2018 and that fifty (50) units of housing will be built in the area.

Councilmember Warner opened to questions from the Council and nobody spoke. Councilmember Warner opened the public hearing.

Yanette Freeman, 526 North Scott Street, South Bend, IN 46616 spoke in favor of the bill but expressed concern about the state of the sidewalks in the area surrounding the new development.

Councilmember Warner asked Chris Dressel if he would like to address this concern.

Chris Dressel acknowledged the need to keep infrastructure consistent in the area and said that he would be happy to receive any additional information regarding the sidewalks that need improvement.

Councilmember Warner stated that maintaining sidewalks is the responsibility of the homeowner but acknowledged that this is a financial burden for many. He said that the 2026 sidewalk allocation will be able to assist homeowners with this.

Councilmember Sharon McBride stated that the City should be looking at sidewalks in the surrounding area during major developments. She noted that sidewalk allocation runs out quickly and that in her district, some people have been waiting for two (2) years. She said the City should consider whether sidewalk replacement during new developments is financially feasible.

Councilmember Warner closed the public hearing.

Chris Godlewski requested to vacate the stub street extending from Emerson Forest Parkway and relocate it south of its current location. He stated that a new connector loop road will be built on the east side of Emerson Forest Parkway, and the number of road connections will not be reduced.

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR

Judy Hagedorn, 2220 Highland Avenue, South Bend, IN 46613, gave an update to the Council on an ongoing nuisance neighbor situation and shared her safety concerns.

Councilmember Niezgodski responded that she has been in contact with the South Bend Police Department (SBPD) regarding the situation. She said that she believes the new developments in the area will help alleviate the issues.

Council Vice President Rachel Tomas Morgan thanked Judy Hagedorn for continuing to bring the situation to the Council's attention and stated that the concerns have been brought to the mayor.

Rodney Hagedorn, 2220 Highland Avenue, South Bend, IN 46613, spoke about the same nuisance neighbor situation. He stated that the individuals involved are causing similar problems at five (5) properties across the city.

Councilmember Sharon McBride replied that if these activities are extending into the Third (3rd) District, she will be able to assist in addressing the situation there.
