



Criminally Assaulted Shooting (CAS) Victims Through Q3 2025

- Since January 2025, there have been 44 Criminally Assaulted Shooting victims
 - 19 of these were in Q3 2025
- 5 Fatal Shootings in 2025
 - 4 of these occurred in Q3 2025
- Total Criminally assaulted shooting victim numbers remain lower than during the same 9-month period (Jan – Sept) the past five years






Traffic Enforcement & Safety Strategy Traffic Stops

- In Q3 2025, there were
 4,413 traffic stops
 - Average of 48 per day for the quarter
- From January –
 September 2025, there have been a total of 10,447 traffic stops
 - This is up 8% compared to the same period last year







Traffic Enforcement & Safety Strategy Vehicle Collisions


- This slide shows vehicle collision data through Q3 2025, with comparisons to the same period in 2024
- Visuals include: Collision count, fatality & injury rates, and a heat map
- Through Q3 2025, there have been 2,149 vehicle collisions. Of these, 0.28% resulted in a fatality, and 32.2% resulted in an injury.

Traffic Enforcement & Safety Strategy Vehicle Collisions

- This slide highlights the top five intersections with the highest number of vehicle collisions through Q3 2025.

Fusus/Real Time Crime Center (RTCC)

What

The Real Time Crime Center (RTCC) leverages the Fusus platform to bring together integrated cameras and other public safety related tools in a centralized hub.

Who

South Bend Police Department

How

- Uses integrated cameras and other public safety technologies to provide a more real-time understanding of incidents
- 30-day photo retention on cloud server
- Limited users with an administrator for account reviews





RTCC Success Stories

A few cases demonstrating the value of RTCC cameras



Situation: A shooting occurred in Maple Lane Apartments.

Cameras helped: RTCC analysts see the suspect run and get into a vehicle. This info was relayed to officers resulting in a pursuit and apprehension. A backpack containing a firearm was discarded by the suspect in the process.

Suspect Apprehended & Firearm Located



Situation: An armed robbery occurred in the parking lot of the Charles Black Center.

Cameras helped: Obtain video of the incident and identify the vehicle using Flock. The vehicle was located at the registered address. A search warrant was conducted, where a firearm was located and the suspect was arrested.

RTCC Success Stories

A few cases demonstrating the value of RTCC cameras



Situation: A shooting occurred near Bowman/Miami.

Cameras helped: RTCC analysts locate the suspect vehicle and identify the vehicle using Flock. With this info, officers were able to locate the vehicle with signs of the window being shot out. Officers then executed a search warrant on the vehicle.

Search Warrant Executed



Situation: An individual escaped from the DuComb center after transport to the hospital.

Cameras helped: Using the description from Dispatch, cameras helped RTCC analysts locate the suspect and provide the info to officers who were able to locate and detain the escapee.

- Utilizes cameras near major thoroughfares
- 30-day photo retention on cloud server

Resource Router

(previously ShotSpotter Connect)

What

Resource Router is a software that provides unbiased, evidence and fact-based direction on where to deploy officers and other department resources and when.

Who

South Bend Police Department

How

- Resource Router collects data on case reports, statements, and evidence from the last 24 hours each morning
- Compares to current and past trends from the last three years; prioritizing gun violence
- Monitors officer responsiveness and accountability through GPS



Resource Router Missions

Measure	Q3 2025
Total number of Resource Router missions	6,636
Average number of missions per day	72 (24/shift)
Missions completed	98%

*Data is only for Q3

- There were a total of 6,636 Resource Router missions in Q3 2025
- SBPD maintained a 98% mission completion rate and an average of 72 missions per day
