A RESOLUTION OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH BEND, INDIANA, PROUDLY & PUBLICLY HONORING AND COMMENDING MAESTRO TSUNG YEH FOR HIS EXEMPLARY AND EXCEPTIONAL MUSICAL TALENTS AND LEADERSHIP FOR 28 SEASONS AS MUSIC DIRECTOR OF THE SOUTH BEND SYMPHONY

Whoreas, the South Bend Common Council notes that 28 years ago, one of five finalists was selected to take the podium to lead the South Bend Symphony Orchestra, with a most talented Maestro having been chosen, who has truly captured the hearts, minds and soul of South Bend – Maestro Tsung Yeh; and

Whoreas, Tsung Yeh was born in Shanghai, China, on May 17, 1950, to his mother who was a vocal professor at the Shanghai Conservatory of Music and to his father, who became a professor at the Shanghai Institute of Foreign Trade, who together had the foresight and vision to send young Tsung for piano lessons beginning at the age of five; and

Whereat, despite experiencing many challenges during the Cultural Revolution which especially affected his parents, Tsung "practiced in secret behind thick, soundproof curtains" of his teacher's home. He graduated from Shanghai Conservatory of Music in 1972, and was sent to sometimes difficult locations during this period of time, later becoming a pianist in 1977 touring Thailand and Singapore; & returning in 1979 to the Shanghai Conservatory of Music to study conducting. In 1983, he was the Mannes College of Music in New York, first foreign-born valedictorian, thereafter earning a scholarship to Yale University's postgraduate music program; and

Whereat, Maestro Tsung Yeh catapulted into his brilliant and extraordinary career as an orchestra conductor, with some of his many outstanding accomplishments including his passion to develop musical talents of youth; conducting the St. Louis Symphony Orchestra, Tampa's Florida Orchestra, Albany, New York's Symphony Orchestra, Chicago Symphony Orchestra; the San Francisco Symphony Orchestra, Northwest Indiana Symphony Orchestra, & became the 1st conductor to ever hold music directorships in both a western symphony orchestra & a Chinese instrument orchestra by leading the South Bend Symphony and the Singapore Chinese Orchestra; and

Whereas, Maestro Tsung Yeh has regularly conducted workshops throughout Europe and Asia, and has been in constant demand as a guest conductor of orchestra in France, Poland, Russia, the Czech Republic, China, Hong Kong, and Taiwan, while developing a stellar and exemplary reputation throughout the United States, where he focuses his energies on "building platforms to nourish young people's hearts and talents" for generations to come.

# Now, Therefore, be it resolved, by the Common Council of the City of South Bend, Indiana, as follows:

<u>Section I.</u> The South Bend Common Council proudly recognizes the **Masestro Tsung Yeh** on brilliantly building the South Bend Symphony Orchestra into "one of the finest regional orchestras in the central United States", and for leading it to win under his baton, the ASCAP award for Excellence in Programming & Performing.

<u>Section II.</u> The Common Council publicly wishes **Masestro Tsung Yeh**, his wife, Sau Lan, and their children Mona, Melina and Joseph, all the very best in the years ahead. You have truly enriched our community. *BRAVO!*



Dear Council Members:

The Common Council of the City of South Bend, Indiana, passed a new zoning ordinance that went into effect on May 7, 2004. Since the passage of that ordinance over 12 years ago, the housing market has continued to change and evolve.

The proposed changes in the attached ordinance, broaden our zoning code definition of group residence to encompass more housing options of interest to persons desiring to live in varied, evolving configurations of shared residential community then previously defined. It also proposes to expand the areas within our City where such group residences may locate as special exempted uses. Specifically, the Central Business District East and the Central Business District West would be additional areas within South Bend to accommodate innovative and market-responsive group housing models to develop.

This proposed ordinance, in conjunction with the above definition and use expansions, also seeks to clarify the definition of family. While Common Council initiated, these proposed ordinance changes have been collaboratively drafted and reviewed with staff members of the Area Plan Commission, as well as, the City of South Bend Department of Community Investment's planning staff and attorneys from the Department of Law. All of the proposed changes are aimed at keeping South Bend competitive and welcoming with respect to changing trends in housing.

I respectively request the Common Council schedule this proposed ordinance for first reading at the July 11<sup>th</sup> Council meeting so that the Bill can be sent to the Area Plan Commission for their meeting of August 16<sup>th</sup>, and to the Council's Zoning and Annexation Committee, with 2<sup>nd</sup> reading, public hearing and 3<sup>rd</sup> reading at the August 22<sup>nd</sup> Common Council meeting. # STATEMENT OF PURPOSE AND INTENT

The Common Council of the City of South Bend, Indiana, adopted a new zoning ordinance that went into effect on May 7, 2004. Since the adoption of the ordinance, the housing market has continued to change and evolve. The proposed changes recognize the growing popularity of non-traditional housing arrangements. Providing an opportunity for Group Residence within the densely populated Central Business District will allow for the changing trend in housing to be accommodated where the services and infrastructure are already in place or can be reasonably developed.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Common Council of the City of South Bend, Indiana as follows:

<u>SECTION I.</u> Chapter 21, Zoning, of the *South Bend Municipal Code*, Article 3 Commercial/Mixed Use Districts, Section 21-03.06 CBD Central Business District, subsection (a) (2) *Special Exception Uses*, is hereby amended as follows:

- (H) Residential (in CBD Districts located west of the St. Joseph River): Multifamily Dwellings; Group Residence
- (I) Residential (in CBD Districts located east of the St. Joseph River): Group Residence (I) (J)

<u>SECTION II.</u> Chapter 21, Zoning, of the *South Bend Municipal Code*, Article 11 Definitions, Section 21-11.02 Definitions, is hereby amended as follows:

Family: One (1) or more persons related by blood, legal adoption or marriage, living and cooking together as a single housekeeping unit, exclusive of household servants; or, a number of persons; or, a number of persons, but not exceeding two (2) who are not related by blood, legal adoption or marriage, living and cooking together as a single housekeeping unit, shall be deemed to constitute a family. A person or persons residing with a family as hereinabove defined by reasons of placement by a publicly licensed placement agency shall be considered as members of that family.

Group Residences: A residential facility which in addition to providing any combination of food, and shelter, may also provide some combination of personal care, social

services, counseling services or transportation to residents; or a residential facility providing common living areas such as a kitchen, living room, dining room or recreational rooms. Group residences would include halfway houses, work release houses or any other similar form of residential facility for individuals which do not qualify as a family or any other form of residential facility expressly provided for in this ordinance.

<u>SECTION III.</u> This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council, approval by the Mayor, and legal publication.
