How we've addressed our Departmental Impact Drivers this month:



Key Performance Indicator's Impacting Ecological Stewardship:

- Removed invasive honeysuckle from riverbanks.
- Planted nine new trees downtown.
- Pruned and provided healthcare to 255 parks trees (mostly Oaks) in City Cemetery, Potawatomi Park, and the Potawatomi Zoo.
- Clean up 41 sites of storm damage resulting from high winds.
- Planted fall flowers in parks and downtown (ornamental kale, mums, and pansies)
- Planted tulip bulbs at O'Brien Center, Mayor's Lot, Martin Luther King Center, and Riverside Drive.
- Installed plants at the Rum Village Dog Park.
- Installed summersweet shrubs in the Elbel Golf Course beds.

Skilled Trades

- Received a matching funds grant for \$189,197 for playground equipment as part of our 2019 MYSB Parks and Trails neighborhood park upgrade. This equipment ranges from a zip line to sensory play for our users who respond better to tactical and audible stimulus.
