Sustainability Planning History

- 2003 Origination of Utilities Long Range Planning Process (ULRP)
- 2004 Energy and Environmental Issues Committee
- 2008 Office of Sustainability established
- 2010 First version of strategy & first long-term emissions reduction goals (Scope 1 & 2)
- 2015 Laudato Si' & Kick-off of comprehensive planning
- September 20, 2016 University of Notre Dame President Father Jenkins released the <u>Comprehensive Sustainability Strategy</u>

Planning Process

- First carbon emissions reduction goal was developed as part of Utilities Long Range Plan
- External benchmarking of peer institutions
- Input from campus constituents e.g. Utilities Long Range Plan Working Group and Task Force, Energy and Environmental Issues Committee, Student Government



By 2030 reduce our Scope 1 and 2 carbon emissions by 50% per gross square foot from 2005 levels.

Our long-range goal is to reduce emissions by 83% from 2005 levels by 2050 and eventually become carbon

Notre Dame's approach was based on the three pillars of sustainability: respecting the human condition, respecting our natural resources, and economic viability.




Sustainability Plan tied to Catholic Perspective

- Principle 7: Care for God's creation




Our Strategy
