Timeline

- August to December 2020
- Reconvening in March 2021

Group

- Included the following: Elected officials, City/County staff, service providers, business owners, community members, SBPD, neighborhood advocates, and academic institutions

Subcommittees

- Health & Sanitation / Weather Amnesty / Permanent Supportive Housing



Implementation Group Recommendations



Subcommittee Working groups

- Group A represents Health & Sanitation (chaired by County Health Office Dr. Robert Einterz)
- Group B represents Housing & Weather Amnesty (led by Deputy Chief of Staff Jordan Gathers)
- Group C represents Long-term permanent support housing (led by NDA President Anne Mannix)



Key Recommendations: Health & Sanitation [A]

- Create, monitor, and maintain a database of all persons experiencing homelessness in St. Joseph County
- Quantity the need for more affordable and permanent supportive housing
- Study the population of people who prey on homeless individuals and develop/implement best practices to reduce the predators' impact
- Monitor, assess, and maintain as needed the chemical toilet behind DTSB as well as laundry services on Wednesdays in partnership with Burton's laundry
- Develop a partnership with Transpo to provide free/affordable transportation
- Augment shower/bathing facilities at willing service provider locations
- Track health insurance status of all homeless individuals
- Continue to make short-term hotel rooms and/or rental units available and accessible to isolate individuals infected with COVID until the pandemic is over



Key Recommendations: Weather Amnesty & Housing [B]

- Continue operations at Weather Amnesty (need COVID-19 rapid testing and vaccine distribution)
- Make available cold weather shelter locations
- Extend current Motel4Now Program
- Work to utilize vacant buildings to house individuals (i.e., schools and churches)
- Develop a low barrier resource center with partners
- Locate parcels for bridge housing units or affordable housing community with wraparound services
- Create mentoring programs and various workshops (i.e., job readiness curriculum, financial, healthy relationships, and career/housing)
- Partner with security companies to protect our most vulnerable population



Key Recommendations: Permanent Supportive Housing [C]

- Expand PSH units, developers, and funding sources in the City
- Develop a Housing Trust Fund
- Create Homelessness Coordinator position
- Support an Education/Advocacy campaign
- Emphasize landlord and developer participation
