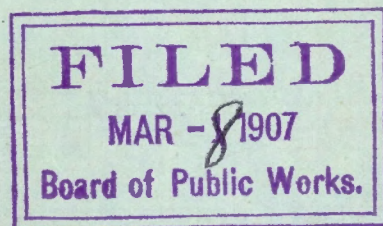

Petition of the Studebaker Brothers' Manufacturing Company for vacation of alley.

The undersigned, Studebaker Brothers' Manufacturing Company, would respectfully petition your Board for the vacation of a short alley bounded on all sides by real property owned by them, situated in Martin and Tutt's Addition to the City of South Bend;

And your petitioners would represent that they are the owners of the block bounded on the North by the Lake Shore and Michigan Southern Railway Company's right of way; on the South by Bronson Street; on the East by Main Street; and on the West by Lafayette Street, in the City of South Bend;

That the same is known and described as all of Lots Nos. Twenty-three (23) and Thirty-three (33) of said Addition, that lies South of said Railway Company's right of way, and the whole of Lots Nos. Twenty-four (24) and Thirty-two (32) of said Martin and Tutt's Addition;

That on the plat of said Addition there is an alley in the center of said Block fourteen (14) feet wide, which extends North from Bronson Street to said Railway right of way;

That said alley has never been opened up across said right of way and has not been used as a public alley, and is of no public utility nor any benefit to the general public as it is closed across said Railway Company's right of way;

That your petitioners desire to improve their property on either side of said alley and to add to the taxable value of their property by making valuable improvements, and that said alley has

heretofore been used by them for the reason that the general public have had no occasion nor necessity for using the same, as it wholly lies within private grounds;

That your petitioners would therefore pray your Honorable Body that the same be vacated, as it will be for the greater advantage of the City in promoting valuable and taxable improvements, and will not in any manner work any disadvantage to the public by closing the same.

Your petitioners attach hereto a map showing the proposed vacation.

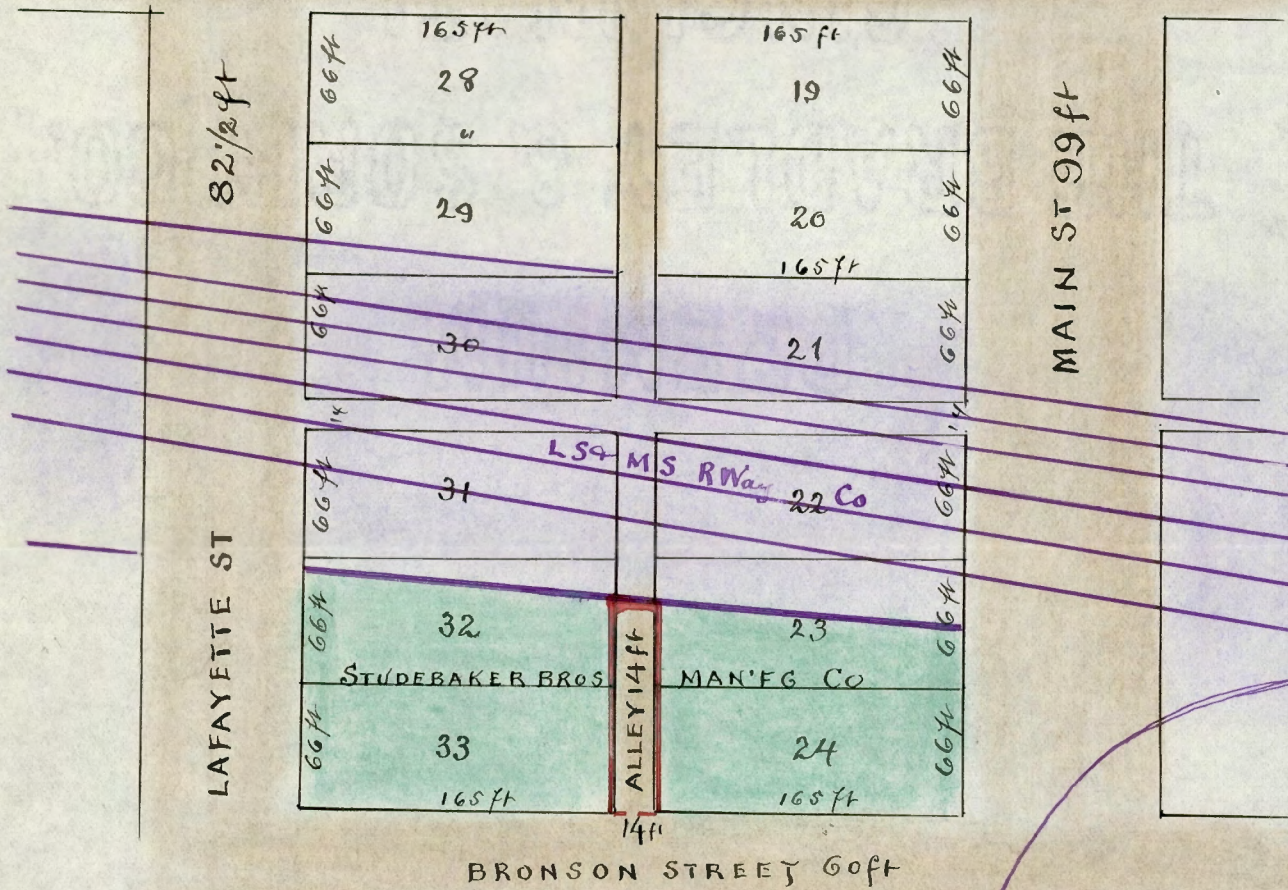
