City To Honor Adeline Wigfall-Jones with Honorary Street Sign

Hairstyles have changed from Afros to Jheri Curls, to High Top Fades, twists, braids, and Dreadlocks, but Wigfall Barbershop has been a constant presence on the corner of Elm and Washington Streets for nearly 50 years.

Adeline Wigfall-Jones opened Wigfall Barbershop at 1131 W. Washington St. in 1976 and it has remained a community institution over the years. "Ms. Adeline," as she is affectionately known, has cut the heads of generations of boys, men, and women. Her shop has also been a vital community meeting place where people share important information, establish, or re-establish relationships and even get a delicious meal of fried chicken or polish sausage. Ms. Adeline's business is one of the few remaining from an era when West Washington street was a center of commerce in the Black community, and Wigfall Barbershop withstood the decay and renewal of the block.
