I. REGULAR MEETING

Attorney Weiss asked that everyone mute their microphone when not speaking and reminded attendees that comments from the public should be saved for the Privilege of the Floor portion of the meeting. Attorney Weiss then read through the agenda to note any additions or corrections.

A. ROLL CALL OF MEMBERS

Board President Dan Jones welcomed the public, called roll, and confirmed the presence of the Board Members.

B. APPROVE MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETINGS

C. <u>ELECTION OF 2024 BOARD OF PUBLIC SAFETY PRESIDENT</u>

Lee Ross nominated Dan Jones for the role of President. With no other nominations, a second by Darryl Heller, and carried by a roll call with Dan Jones abstaining from the vote, the Board elected Dan Jones as the 2024 President for the Board of Public Safety.

D. POLICE DEPARTMENT

1. APPROVE HIRING OF PROBATIONARY POLICE OFFICERS



Ms. Claeys asked if the structure incidents involved abandoned houses.

Chief Buchanon noted that they also include abandoned businesses. He added that people seeking shelter enter these homes and businesses and start a fire and sometimes leave the fire burning which then starts a larger fire.

Mr. Ross asked Chief Buchanon if fire blankets work and if the SBFD had considered asking for donations, so they could be given out to community members.

Chief Buchannon stated that Fire Blankets are beneficial, and they have had conversation about donations which will continue in the coming months.
