2024 Police Data Trends: *Gun Violence Snapshot*

647 Gun Violence Incidents	705 Guns Recovered	62 Criminally Assaulted Shooting Victims
Previous Year Incidents: 795	Previous Year Guns: 730	Previous Year Victims: 80

Data Notes:

*Gun violence incidents encompass any incidents involving a gun, making it a broader category than just shootings

**Victim counts do not include accidental shootings, suicides or shootings that have been determined as self-defense



2024 Police Data Trends: Criminally Assaulted Shooting (CAS) Victims

 2024 saw a continuation of the downward trend in CAS victims from 2023


• In 2024, the number of victims (62) and the fatality rate (8.1%) reached their lowest levels in the past five years





2024 Police Data Trends: Calls For Service (CFS)


- Continuing the upward trend from 2023, 2024 saw the highest number of CFS (102,085) in the past five years
- Mental Health related calls accounted for 1.5% of total CFS

2024 Police Data Trends: Calls for Service (CFS) for Possible Shots Fired & Casings Collected

- 2024 saw 1,369 CFS for possible Shots Fired, a reduction from the number of calls in the previous two years. This CFS count includes both ShotSpotter notifications and/or Citizen-initiated calls.
 - Generated 581 Case Reports
- 4,199 casings collected




Traffic Enforcement & Safety Strategy

- Across 2024, there were 11,946 total traffic stops, for an average of 32.7 per day
- Traffic stops in Q2 and Q3 of 2024 matched 2023 levels, but Q1 saw more stops and Q4 experienced a sharper decline

Fusus/Real Time Crime Center (RTCC)

What

The Real Time Crime Center (RTCC) leverages the Fusus platform to bring together integrated cameras and other public safety related tools in a centralized hub.

Who

South Bend Police Department

How

- Uses integrated cameras and other public safety technologies to provide a more real-time understanding of incidents
- 30-day photo retention on cloud server
- Limited users with an administrator for account reviews



Data on when Fusus is noted in a case report as having provided evidence/video footage for a case



RTCC Success Stories

A few cases demonstrating the value of RTCC integrated cameras



Situation: A bank robbery occurred.

Cameras helped: RTCC analysts track the suspect's path of travel. The suspect was observed getting on a Transpo bus where they were observed their mask, leading to suspect identification.

Suspect Identified



Situation: Crime Analysts identify a trend of vehicle larcenies and vandalisms downtown.

Cameras helped: RTCC analysts connect multiple incidents to the same individual. This led to identification of both the suspect and their crime pattern.

> Suspect & Crime Trend Identified

Of note: In both instances both City + Partner integrated cameras were leveraged

What

Technology-based crime reduction strategy to develop possible leads in criminal cases and keep community safe from outside threats.

Who

South Bend Police Department

How

- Utilizes cameras near major thoroughfares to take photos of the backs of vehicles
- 30-day photo retention on cloud server
- Limited users with an administrator for account reviews

Resource Router (previously ShotSpotter Connect)

What

Resource Router is a software that provides unbiased, evidence-based direction on where to deploy officers and other department resources and when.

Who

South Bend Police Department

How

- Resource Router collects data on case reports, statements, and evidence from the last 24 hours each morning
- Compares to current and past trends from the last three years; prioritizing gun violence
- Monitors officer **responsiveness** and **accountability** through GPS



Resource Router Missions

ShotSpotter Connect has been renamed to Resource Router

Average number of missions per day	72 (24/shift)		72
Missions completed	99	9%	98%

- There were a total of 26,215 Resource Router missions in 2024
- SBPD maintained a 99% mission completion rate and an average of 72 missions per day
